SUMMARY OF MEETINGS

General Committee:

2nd meeting

The Committee considered item 25 of the agenda, "Examination of delegates' credentials". The Committee also considered a request for the restoration of voting rights made by Belarus.

Plenary:

7th meeting

The Conference continued with item 7 of the agenda, "General debate and Annual Report for 1999". Statements were made by the delegates of Sri Lanka, Kenya, Estonia, Uzbekistan, Bolivia, Yemen, Mongolia, Jordan, Luxembourg, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Malta, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Romania.

Under item 5 of the agenda, the Conference adopted the recommendation of the General Committee to accede to the request of Belarus for the restoration of voting rights.

Under item 8 of the agenda, "Election of Members to the Board of Governors", the following Member States were elected to serve on the Board of Governors from 2000-2002: Argentina, Egypt, Ghana, Ireland, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mexico, Pakistan, Peru, Switzerland, Thailand and Ukraine.

Committee of the Whole:

5th meeting

The Committee dealt with item 19 of the agenda, "Outcomes of the NPT Review Conference relevant to the activities of the IAEA", and agreed to recommend draft resolution contained in document GC(44)/L.16.

The Committee resumed its consideration of item 18 of the agenda, "Strengthening the Agency's activities related to nuclear science, technology and applications".

Plenary:

8th meeting

The Conference concluded item 7 of the agenda. Statements were made by the delegates of Portugal, Ethiopia, the United Republic of Tanzania and Panama.

The Committee continued its consideration of item 18, and agreed to recommend the draft resolution “Strengthening the Agency’s activities related to nuclear science, technology and applications”, contained in document GC(44)/L.18.and GC(44)/L.20.

The Committee resumed its consideration of item 15, “Strengthening of the Agency’s technical co-operation activities”, and agreed to recommend the draft resolution contained in document GC(44)/L.17, one delegate did not join in the consensus on that recommendation.

The Committee resumed its consideration of item 14, “Measures to strengthen international co-operation in nuclear, radiation and waste safety”, and agreed to recommend the draft resolution contained in document GC(44)/L19.
