GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS

The Conference is meeting in the Austria Center Vienna (ACV), Bruno Kreisky Platz 1, 1220 Vienna, which is located next to the Vienna International Centre (VIC). The ACV telephone number is 212 44 00.

The starting time of all meetings will be announced in the Journal. Delegates are requested to be in their places by those times to allow meetings to start punctually. Evening meetings will be announced during the session if they become necessary.

FORMALITIES ON ARRIVAL

Each participant will require a badge with a photograph for entry into the ACV during the session. Exhibition on technical co-Operation between the IAEA and the Republic of Korea

The delegation of the Republic of Korea has prepared a 6th Exhibition on Technical Co-operation between the IAEA and the Republic of Korea. The theme is *"Technical Cooperation, making the world a better place: a Better Partnership for a Better World"*.

The Exhibition will focus on the examples of technical cooperation with the IAEA, with particular emphasis on the Advanced Power Reactor 1400 (APR 1400), which would establish another landmark in the nuclear power technology development in Korea.

It will be on display from 16 to 18 September during the 46th General Conference session and will be located between Foyers A and B, 2nd floor at the ACV. It will also be officially opened on Tuesday, 17 September at 12.45 p.m.

Exhibit on (Technical Co-Operation) between the IAEA and Romania

The delegation of Romania has prepared an Exhibit on technical cooperation between the IAEA and Romania. The theme is "The Nuclear Sector in Romania and international co-operation in nuclear related matters".

The exhibit will be on display from 16 to 20 September and will be located between Foyers A and B, 2nd floor at the ACV. The Head of the Romanian delegation and his alternate will be available to answer questions and provide information every day from 9.40 to 10.00 a.m. and from 2.40 to 3.00 p.m. A video film on the Romanian nuclear sector will be running constantly, and a CD-ROM with the film and brochures will be made available to visitors who request one.

Safeguards Exhibit

Since its inception, the Department of Safeguards has been developing equipment to be used in safeguarding nuclear facilities. In order to demonstrate the advances made, the Department of Safeguards has in Foyer C, an exhibit which shows the evolution of equipment technologies.

The opening ceremony will take place in Foyer C on Monday, 16 September at 2.15 p.m. It will be followed by films on "Safeguards Equipment Systems" and "Protecting Safeguards Information".

These films will continue to run throughout the week from 10.00 am to 1.00 p.m. and from 3.00 to 6.00 p.m.

Briefing On New Developments At The Abdus Salam International Centre For Theoretical Physics (ICTP)

The Acting Director of the Abdus Salam International Centre for Theoretical Physics (ICTP – Trieste, Italy) and IAEA staff will be available to brief interested IAEA Member States on new developments at the ICTP – both scientific and managerial.

Visit to IAEA Laboratories in Seibersdorf

The Laboratories, situated about 35 km southeast of Vienna and contribute to the Agency's programmes through experimental activities relating to nuclear verification, applications of radiation and isotopes in food and agriculture, the sterile-insect technique, and nuclear contaminants in the environment. The Laboratories are also a training centre for scientists from developing countries. In addition, quality control services for analytical and radiometric measurements and radiation applications are provided from Seibersdorf for the benefit of Member States' laboratories and institutes.

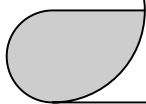
