## SUMMARY OF MEETINGS

### Plenary 5<sup>th</sup> meeting

The Conference resumed item 7 of the agenda, “General debate and Annual Report for 2003”. Statements were made by the delegates of Zimbabwe, Finland, India, Israel, Brazil, Pakistan, Cuba, Syrian Arab Republic, Senegal, Belarus, Italy and Niger. A statement was made by the Executive Secretary of the Preparatory Commission for the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty Organization (CTBTO).

### Committee of the Whole 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting

The Committee, during the morning session, agreed to recommend to the Conference for adoption the following draft resolutions:

- under agenda item 13, “Measures to Strengthen International Cooperation in Nuclear, Radiation and Transport Safety and Waste Management”, the draft resolution GC(48)/COM.5/L.11 on “Transport Safety”; and
- under agenda item 16, “Strengthening the Agency’s activities related to nuclear science, technology and applications”, the draft resolution GC(48)/COM.5/L.4, on “Development of the Sterile Insect Technique for the Control or Eradication of Malaria-Transmitting Mosquitoes”.

It then took up agenda item 17, “Strengthening the effectiveness and improving the efficiency of the safeguards system and application of the Model Additional Protocol” and after initial discussion on how to proceed, agreed to establish a working group, to be chaired by Ambassador Grönberg of Finland, starting today at 11.30 a.m. in Meeting Room M, in order to deliberate on draft resolution GC(48)/COM.5/L.10.

The Committee then reverted to agenda item 15, and resumed discussion on draft resolution GC(48)/COM.5/L.1 on “Strengthening the Agency’s Technical Cooperation Activities”. However, since a consensus could not be reached, the Chairman suggested that the sponsors of the draft resolution and those Member States, which had suggested amendments, consult to come up with a consensus text.

Before it adjourned, the Committee continued with item 13 and took up draft resolution GC(48)/COM.5/L.9 on “International Nuclear and Radiological Emergency Preparedness and Response”.

### Plenary 6<sup>th</sup> meeting

The Conference resumed consideration of item 7 of the agenda, “General debate and Annual Report for 2003”. Statements were made by the delegates of Latvia, Kazakhstan, Greece, Indonesia, Turkey, Namibia, Malaysia, Holy See, Slovenia, Angola, Argentina, Czech Republic, United Arab Emirates, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Zambia, United Republic of Tanzania, Afghanistan, Haiti and Vietnam. A statement was made by the Secretary General of the Agency for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America and the Caribbean (OPANAL).

4<sup>th</sup> meeting**

In the afternoon, the Committee agreed to recommend to the Conference for adoption, the following draft resolutions under agenda item 13:

- GC(48)/COM.5/L.9 on “International Nuclear and Radiological Emergency Preparedness and Response”; and
- GC(48)/COM.5/L.5/Rev.1, an omnibus resolution that combined GC(48)/COM.5/L.7 with chapter 7 of GC(48)/COM.5/L.5. As a result of this, draft resolution GC(48)/COM.5/L.7 was withdrawn.

Also under item 13, the Committee took up draft resolution GC(48)/COM.5/L.13 on “Agency Activities in the Development of Innovative Nuclear Technology”, and after some deliberation agreed to defer further discussion until tomorrow morning.

The meeting was then adjourned.

To make more efficient use of the general debate, and in line with recommendations on streamlining the work of the General Conference, delegates are urged to keep the duration of their oral presentations down to **15 minutes at the most**, by focusing on the main points which they wish to make. Copies of the full texts (in the original language) will be made available to other delegates during the session, if delegates so request.

To facilitate interpretation, the texts of statements to be delivered should be handed to the Conference Officer in advance. In addition, to facilitate the posting of statements on the Agency’s website, copies of statements should be provided in electronic form as early as possible to the IAEA Division of Public Information. ### ***Presentation on the 'Illicit Trafficking Database'***

Presentation on the IAEA Illicit Trafficking Database (ITDB) operations and global illicit trafficking trends and patterns between 1993–2003.

The presentation has been organized by the IAEA Office of Nuclear Security. The ITDB is a key contributor to the IAEA's activities to help strengthen nuclear security worldwide and prevent nuclear and radiological terrorism. This is a unique database, which contains information confirmed by the States involved about incidents involving illicit trafficking in nuclear and other radioactive materials. The ITDB staff will provide the participants with an overview of the ITDB programme and operations, as well as results of the evaluation of information contained in the database. Participants will also receive an ITDB information package.

Presentation on and hands-on demonstration of the Source Catalogue as a useful database for experts to safely recover sources of unknown origin.

The IAEA Waste Technology Section (WTS) of the Division of Nuclear Fuel Cycle and Waste Technology has organized this presentation. The Source Catalogue is considered a useful tool in implementing the Agency's comprehensive approach to nuclear security covering all the activities that contribute to prevention and detection of, and response to malicious acts with radioactive sources. In response to the interest of the Member States, this presentation has been organized to promote awareness of the Source Catalogue, the first version of which will be available for distribution to the IAEA Member States by the end of this year. The WTS will provide the participants with relevant background information and an overview of the Source Catalogue followed by a hands-on computer demonstration. In addition, a poster will be displayed and there will be a continuous Power-Point presentation on problematic issues regarding sealed sources. The participants will also receive relevant information material.
