SUMMARY OF MEETINGS

PLENARY 7th meeting (morning session)

The Conference resumed item 8 of the agenda, “General debate and Annual Report for 2004”. Statements were made by the delegates of Belgium Niger, Hungary, Bolivia, Myanmar, Afghanistan, Paraguay, Albania, Ghana, and by a representative of the European Commission.

Under item 13 of the agenda “Appointment of the External Auditor”, contained in document GC(49)/11, the Conference agreed to the appointment of the Vice-President of the German Supreme Audit Institution as the External Auditor for the Agency’s accounts for the financial years 2006 and 2007.

With regard to the restoration of voting rights, the Conference agreed that the voting rights of Iraq be restored for the reasons given in document GC(49)/INF/13.

Under item 26 of the agenda, “Examination of delegates’ credentials” on which the General Committee presented its report contained in document GC(49)/27, the Conference adopted the draft resolution contained in paragraph 7 of the General Committee’s report, with the reservations and position expressed therein.

Under item 9 of the agenda, “Election of Members to the Board of Governors”, the following Member States were elected to serve on the Board of Governors during the period 2005–2007: Belarus, Colombia, Cuba, Egypt, Greece, Indonesia, Norway, Slovenia, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Republic of Korea and Syrian Arab Republic.

Before the Conference adjourned its morning session the Rapporteur of the Scientific Forum made a report.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE 5th meeting (morning session)

The Committee started its morning session by concluding its deliberation on draft resolution GC(49)/COM.5/L.7 entitled “Programme of Action for Cancer Therapy” tabled under agenda item 18, and agreed to recommend its adoption to the Conference.

The Committee then returned to agenda item 17, “Strengthening the Agency’s technical cooperation activities”, namely, draft resolution GC(49)/COM.5/L.1/Rev.1 and proposed that it be referred to a working group under the chairmanship of Ambassador Poptchev of Bulgaria in an attempt to reach a consensus text.

The Committee then took up agenda item 15, “Measures to strengthen international cooperation in nuclear, radiation and transport safety and waste management” and agreed to recommend for adoption draft resolution GC(49)/COM.5/L.15 on “Transport Safety” which was introduced by one of the main co-sponsors, namely, New Zealand.

Under agenda item 16 “Nuclear security – measures to protect against nuclear terrorism”, the Committee moved to take up draft resolution GC(49)/COM.5/L.13 “Progress on measures to protect against nuclear and radiological terrorism”. After initial discussion it deferred further deliberation to allow for consultations. Also under this agenda item, draft resolution GC(49)/COM.5/L.14 “Amendment to the Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material” was disposed of without much debate and its adoption by the Conference was recommended.

Under agenda item 25, “Elections to the Agency’s Staff Pension Committee”, the Committee elected Mr Julio Mollinedo Claros of the delegation of Bolivia and Mr Allan Wright of the delegation of South Africa, as alternate members to represent the General Conference on the Agency’s Staff Pension Committee.

Thereafter, the meeting adjourned.

PLENARY

**8th meeting

session)**

The Conference resumed consideration of item 8 of the agenda, “General debate and Annual Report for 2004”. Statements were made by Ireland, Greece, Sri Lanka, Armenia, Singapore, Ethiopia, Palestine and Peru.

**6th meeting
(afternoon
session)**

In the afternoon the Committee took up agenda item 24 “Amendment to Article VI of the Statute” and agreed to recommend to the Conference for adoption the draft decision contained in document GC(49)/COM.5/L.16.

With regard to agenda item 16, it suspended discussion once again on draft resolution GC(49)/COM.5/L.13 “Progress on measures to protect against nuclear and radiological terrorism”.

It then reverted to agenda item 17 “Strengthening the Agency’s technical cooperation activities” and attempted to reach consensus of the revised text contained in draft resolution GC(49)/COM.5/L.1/Rev.2. Amendments were made to this revision and a request was made to produce a printed version of the new text.

When the Committee adjourned its afternoon session, adoption of the above resolutions were still pending.

**7th meeting
(night session)**

Upon resumption, the Committee, during its night session, concluded its work by agreeing to recommend the following to the Conference:

- Under agenda item 17 “Strengthening the Agency’s technical cooperation activities”, the adoption of the revised draft resolution contained in document GC(49)/COM.5/L.1/Rev.3;
- Under agenda item 16, the adoption of the draft resolution contained in GC(49)/COM.5/L.13 “Progress on measures to protect against nuclear and radiological terrorism”;
- Under agenda item 19 “Strengthening the effectiveness and improving the efficiency of the safeguards system and application of the Model Additional Protocol”, the Chairman stated that he would report to the Conference that there was agreement on the draft resolution GC(49)/COM.5/L.12/Rev.1, with the exception of one operative paragraph (o.p. 3).

The Committee of the Whole adjourned its final session.

An exhibit on “African Malaria Mosquito Sterile Insect Technique” continues to be on display near Foyer A on the 2nd floor of the ACV.

As of 2004, the IAEA, in collaboration with selected Member States, has embarked on the development of the sterile insect technique for the control of African malaria mosquitoes. The feasibility of this approach is currently being investigated in the Agency’s laboratories in Seibersdorf, with field site preparation underway in Sudan and La Reunion. Expansion of activities to other mosquitoes and diseases (e.g. dengue) is anticipated and can be discussed at the exhibition.

As in the previous years, Argentine nuclear technology capabilities are exhibited with the participation — under the leadership of the National Atomic Energy Commission — of representatives of its nuclear technology complex, namely, CONUAR, INVAP, ENSI, DIOXITEK and NASA. The topics covered in the exhibition include reactors and related ‘turnkey’ plants, supplies, equipment and devices, medicine and services.

Nuclear English, the first textbook for English learners working in the nuclear field, is being exhibited at the World Nuclear Association (WNA) stand at Foyer B on the 2nd floor.

The textbook is composed of 12 units, each covering a different aspect of the nuclear fuel cycle or a relevant topic such as non-proliferation, safety and the use of radioisotopes in medicine. A technical background is not a requirement for the course; however, learners need to have reached an intermediate level of English.

Nuclear English features:

- An audio CD containing authentic interviews with industry specialists. The course covers various accents, including British, American, Australian, South African and Indian.
- Transcripts of the listening materials
- A glossary of key terms
- An answer key
- A downloadable teacher's guide to help teachers maximize the learning potential of the materials.

The author Serge Gorlin, writer and analyst at the WNA, will be happy to present the course at any time.

Fire extinguishers and push-button alarms are allocated close to every staircase and inside the meeting-rooms.</p> <p>The necessity for an evacuation of parts of the ACV or the entire complex will be communicated by the UN Security and Safety Services (UNSSS) personnel or by means of the public address system.</p> <p>Please follow the directions of the UNSSS personnel and evacuate the area via the communicated emergency escape route.
