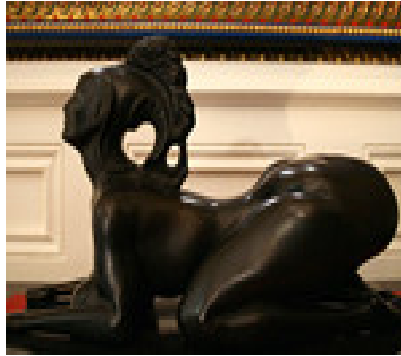

## Ernst Fuchs Museum

The museum is housed in a villa designed by the celebrated secessionist architect Otto Wagner. It was used as a summer house by Wagner's family in 1888. At one stage, it was earmarked for demolition, but for Ernst Fuchs who purchased the building in 1972. Today it serves as a fitting location for exhibitions of Fuchs' own artwork and sculpture. Fuchs' work draws on a number of artistic styles, from the middle ages to modern times, with later compositions emphasising bright colours (a style dubbed "Fantastic Realism").

Rooms in the villa contain a mixture of artwork and sculpture, with additional sculptures within the museum's grounds. Elsewhere, visitors will find it hard to miss the Nymphaeum pump room, also situated in the garden.
