

## **Kenji Shibuya**

**Graduate School of Medicine, University of Tokyo, Japan**



Kenji Shibuya is Professor and Chair of Global Health Policy at the University of Tokyo's Graduate School of Medicine and President of the Japan Institute for Global Health. He obtained his Doctor of Medicine Degree from the University of Tokyo and his Doctorate in International Health Economics from the Harvard University. He joined the World Health Organization's Global Programme on Evidence for Health Policy in 2001 and was Chief of the Health Statistics and Evidence Unit from 2005 to 2008. He has publications on mortality, causes of death, burden of disease, risk factors, cost-effectiveness, priority setting, health system performance assessment and health

diplomacy. He led the strategic direction of the Japanese global health policy agenda after the Hokkaido Toyako G8 Summit in 2008. Mr Shibuya also led the Lancet Series on Japan in an effort to start debate on domestic and global health policy reform. He chaired the landmark Health Care 2035 Advisory Panel for the Minister of Health, Labour and Welfare and is currently Executive Advisor on Global Health for the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare.
