#CNREP2018 Young Innovative Communicators Competition



Participants: Open to persons from IAEA Member States aged 18-25

Submission Deadline: Friday 15 June 2018, at 11:59pm, Vienna Time (CET)

Limit: One entry per individual

Language: The working language of the symposium will be in English. All submissions and

presentations must be in English.

SUBMISSION

Each submission should include the following:

- (a) A description of the concept (maximum 1000 words), provided as a PDF file (official submission form available on the symposium webpage at https://www.iaea.org/events/communicating-nuclear-and-radiological-emergencies-symposium-2018), including:
 - Summary A summary of no more than 100 words of the concept, including the main problem being addressed.
 - Explanation An explanation to detail the concept, for example, the background, what tools will be used, and why it is relevant for communicating in nuclear or radiological emergencies.
 - Implementation How would the concept work in practice? Who would be required to support it? What is the target market?
- **(b)** A profile Information about the participant, full name, nationality, date of birth, affiliation (educational institution or company/organization)

The overall themes that are expected to be discussed at the international symposium are as follows: Emergency Preparedness and Response; Stakeholder Engagement; Public Communication Channels and Tools in Emergencies; Social Media; Effective Communication; Psychology of Communication; Coordination of Information; Communicating in Different Types

of Emergencies; "Am I safe?" and Lessons Learned from Past Emergencies. More information and expected technical topics can be found on the symposium-webpage.

Five finalists will be invited to Vienna, Austria to present their innovative concepts at the International Symposium from 1 to 5 October 2018. The IAEA will cover travel and daily subsistence allowance. The five finalists will also make an exclusive visit to the IAEA Incident and Emergency Centre and the IAEA Press Office and meet with experts on nuclear emergency communication.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The competition is open to nationals of IAEA Member States.
- 2. Applicants must be between 18-25 years old on date of submission of concept. Those who are chosen as finalists will be requested to send their identification documents (e.g. copy of passport) to prove eligibility.
- 3. Entries must be in English. However, English proficiency is not the main criteria for winning.
- 4. Only one submission per individual is allowed. Any revision will not be possible after the concept is officially submitted. Please carefully check your concept before submitting.
- 5. Each submission should be free of images, graphics and tables that may violate or infringe upon the copyright of any other person or organization. It is the responsibility of the participants and not of the IAEA to ensure that all contents used in the concept is free from copyright.
- 6. All content must be provided by the applicants themselves, except for quotations from published and unpublished sources which are clearly indicated and acknowledged as such. Any content that can be identified as plagiarism will immediately be disqualified.
- 7. By submitting the concept summary, participants agree to assign to the IAEA the copyright to publish the presentation on the IAEA website, social media and other platforms and certify that no other rights have been granted which could conflict with the right hereby given to the IAEA.
- 8. The deadline for submission is 15 June 2018, at 11:59 PM (CET). Applications submitted after this time will not be considered.
