

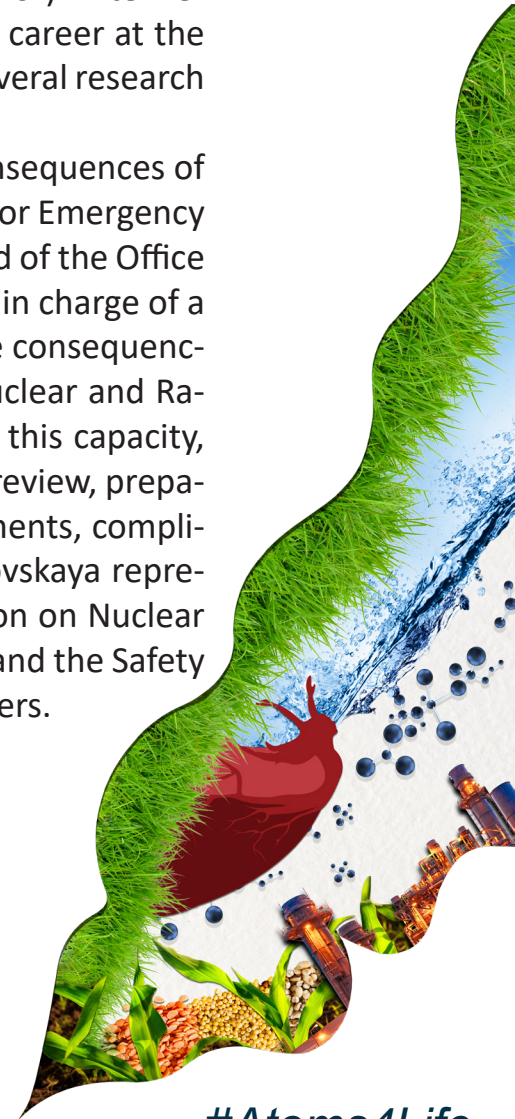


Ms Olga Lugovskaya

Head, Gosatomnadzor, Belarus

Olga Lugovskaya is the Head of the Department for Nuclear and Radiation Safety of the Ministry for Emergency Situations (MES) of Belarus (Gosatomnadzor). After receiving her degree in Nuclear Physics in 1987, Lugovskaya started her career at the Scientific and Research Institute for Nuclear Physics, where she held several research positions and obtained her PhD.

In 2001, Lugovskaya joined the Committee on the Problems of the Consequences of the Catastrophe at the Chernobyl nuclear power plant of the Ministry for Emergency Situations of Belarus (Comchernobyl). In 2008, she was appointed Head of the Office for Science and International Cooperation of the Department and was in charge of a wide range of issues related to overcoming the Chernobyl catastrophe consequences. In 2011, Lugovskaya was assigned Head of the Department for Nuclear and Radiation Safety of the Ministry for Emergency Situations of Belarus. In this capacity, she supervises the overall management related to inspections, safety review, preparation of MES decisions regarding licensing, drafting regulatory documents, compliance with legislation in the field of nuclear and radiation safety. Lugovskaya represents Gosatomnadzor at international events related to the Convention on Nuclear Safety, the Joint Convention on the Safety of Spent Fuel Management and the Safety of Radioactive Waste Management, WENRA, VVER Forum, among others.
