

BIOGRAPHY OF MS CHIN SIEW FEI

Ms CHIN Siew Fei heads the Vienna Office of the Permanent Mission of Singapore to the IAEA in her capacity as Deputy Resident Representative and Minister-Counsellor. She is concurrently Singapore's Sous-Sherpa to the Nuclear Security Summit process, a position she has held since 2009. Her previous assignments at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Singapore included positions dealing with International Organisations, Europe, Technical Cooperation, International Economics and Northeast Asia. She served as First Secretary and Consul at the then-Singapore Commission and Singapore Consulate-General in Hong Kong respectively, during the transition from British to Chinese rule from 1995 - 1998. From 2001 – 2004, she was assigned as First Secretary in Brussels with concurrent accreditation to the European Communities, Belgium, the Netherlands, Luxembourg and the Holy See.

Ms Chin graduated with a second upper Honours degree in Philosophy from the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences at the National University of Singapore after being placed on the Dean's list the year before. She holds a Masters degree in Diplomacy & International Relations from the Diplomatic School of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of Spain. Ms Chin was conferred the Commendation Medal (Pingat Kepujian) as part of the 2012 Singapore National Day Awards. She is a member of the International Advisory Board of the Vienna Centre for Disarmament and Non-Proliferation (VCDNP) since 2011. She speaks English, Mandarin Chinese, French, Spanish, and Cantonese. She plays tennis.
