COUNTRY STATEMENT TO THE 63rd REGULAR SESSION OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE OF THE INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC ENERGY AGENCY 16th – 20th SEPTEMBER 2019, VIENNA, AUSTRIA

President Magufuli commended the technical cooperation and support provided by the Agency to Bugando Medical Centre.
