IACRNE Inter-Agency Committee on Radiological and Nuclear Emergencies

To facilitate and coordinate inter-agency cooperation in case of an emergency, the IAEA, together with other relevant international intergovernmental organizations, established the Inter-Agency Committee on Radiological and Nuclear Emergencies (IACRNE).

The IACRNE was established in September 1986 in the aftermath of the Chernobyl accident. Members of the IACRNE develop, maintain and co-sponsor the Joint Radiation Emergency Management Plan of the International Organizations — the Joint Plan. The Joint Plan describes a common understanding of how each organization acts during a response and describes the arrangements for coordinated response. The IAEA provides the secretariat for the IACRNE and coordinates the maintenance and the further strengthening of the Joint Plan.
