## Statement by H.E. Luca Beccari

Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of San Marino

We reiterate our concern about the lack of openness of a number of Countries and we appeal to them to comply with their commitments.

San Marino promotes education, cooperation, dialogue, negotiation and trust building activities in order to achieve peace and a world free of weapons of mass destruction.
