

## KEY FACTS



Approved by the IAEA Board of Governors in 1997, the Additional Protocol supplements a State's safeguards agreement



While concluded voluntarily, the Additional Protocol becomes legally binding once it enters into force



As of 1 January 2022, 138 States had an Additional Protocol in force

## KEY CHARACTERISTICS

### BROADER INFORMATION



A State's nuclear fuel cycle research and development activities



All parts of a State's nuclear fuel cycle, from uranium mines to nuclear waste



Manufacturing and export of sensitive nuclear-related equipment and material



### BROADER ACCESS



Any building on a nuclear site at short-notice (2-hour or 24-hour access)



Any State declared location related to the nuclear fuel cycle



Any other locations for the collection of environmental samples



### BROADER CONCLUSION

A Comprehensive Safeguards Agreement and an Additional Protocol need to be in force and implemented to enable the IAEA to conclude that all nuclear material in a State remained in peaceful activities
