EPR2025 Infographic Design Contest Terms and Conditions

- 1. The competition is open to nationals of IAEA Member States.
- 2. Participants must be between 18 and 35 years old on the date of submission.
- 3. Only individual submissions are allowed, and each participant may submit only one entry.
- 4. The official language of the contest is English; therefore, all content of the submissions—including text in the infographic and any spoken or written elements in the video—must be in English.
- 5. The infographic must be an original work by the participant and should be free of elements that may violate or infringe upon the copyright of any other person or organization. It is the responsibility of the participant and not of the IAEA to ensure that all content used in the drawing is free from copyright. Any infringing infographic will immediately be disqualified.
- 6. Al tools may be used to assist with inspiration but cannot be used to generated designs. The information provided in the infographics cannot be generated by Al. Works that are 100% Al-generated will not be accepted. All Al assistance must be explicitly disclosed. This disclosure should include which elements were created with Al assistance, which Al tools were used, and how Al was incorporated. Failure to disclose Al usage will result in disqualification.
- 7. The infographic must be in PDR, JPEG or PNG format with a high, unblurry resolution. Both horizontal and vertical formats are allowed.
- The first submission consists of an infographic, which must be sent as an attachment to EPRFuture@iaea.org, along with the completion of the online form available at the following link: https://forms.cloud.microsoft/e/YHYTWL88QU
- 9. Participants must complete the online form using the same email address from which the infographic is sent. The list of selected IAEA EPR publications is available within the form.
- 10. The deadline for submission is Sunday, August 17th, 2025, at 11:59 PM (CET). Submissions received after the deadline will not be considered.
- 11. Entries will be evaluated by an expert jury based on visual clarity, originality, and particular emphasis in technical accuracy.
- 12. Shortlisted participants will be notified during the first week of September via the email address provided. Upon notification, they will be required to submit a short video responding to a question related to the involvement of early career professionals in EPR. The specific question will be disclosed at the time of notification, and participants will have two weeks to submit their video.
- 13. Winning participants will be notified during the first week of October. Once notified, winners must respond within 10 natural days and provide the requested documents, which may include, but are not limited to, a copy of the picture page of a valid passport and the editable design file of the infographic. Failure to respond within this timeframe will result in forfeiture of the prize.
- 14. Winning participants are expected to present at the conference as part of an early career panel session, where the topics will relate to the involvement of early career professionals in EPR, as addressed in their second submission—the 5-minute video. This will give them the opportunity to further develop and improve their presentation for the live session.
- 15. If selected as a finalist, the participant agrees to assign to the IAEA all copyright in and to the infographic, including, but not limited to the right to publish, transmit, sell, distribute, modify, create derivative works and otherwise use the drawing in electronic and print versions throughout the world, in all languages and in all media of expression now known or later developed, and to licence or permit others to do so; and the participant certifies that no other rights have been granted which could conflict with the right hereby given to the IAEA.
- 16. By submitting the infographic, the participant further agrees that the IAEA, UN-NYG may publish the infographic together with the participant's full name, age and nationality on their websites and, social media and other platforms.
- 17. Data collected will not be shared further than outlined in these terms and kept only for the purpose of notifying and acknowledging the winners and organize the travel arrangements, thereafter the data collected will be deleted. All personal data will be treated in accordance with the IAEA's Personal Data Privacy Policy available <u>here</u>.
