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Dr. Chao received her MPH and Ph.D. in Epidemiology (minor in Biostatistics) from the University of California, Los Angeles; she received her BS in Gerontology and M.S. in Applied Biometry from the University of Southern California. She joined the Center for Global Health, National Cancer Institute (NCI) in January 2012 as its representative in East Asia, based in Beijing, China. Since 2017, Dr. Chao has been assigned by the NCI to work with multilateral partners, based at the U.S. Permanent Mission to the United Nations in Geneva, Switzerland. Dr. Chao supports cooperation in national cancer control planning and implementation, health surveillance, training, and cancer research in basic, population, and clinical research. Prior to joining the NCI, Dr. Chao lived and conducted epidemiologic research studies in the U.S., Rwanda, Zambia, and China. Her research at the SEER New Mexico Tumor Registry and at the American Cancer Society (Cancer Prevention Studies) focused on modifiable lifestyle and familial risk factors associated with cancer incidence, mortality, and early detection.
