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I. ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS

1. THE CONFERENCE AREA

The fourth regular session of the General Conference will be held in the Neus Hofburg, Heldenplatz, Vienna I.

The position of the building in the inner city (Innere Stadt) is shown on the plan on page 36. Because of construction work on the Ring, the pattern of traffic to and from the building is liable to change. A chart showing the route to be followed by delegation cars will therefore be published in the first three issues of the Journal (see section 20 below). Plenary meetings and some committee meetings will be held in the Festsaal and other committees will, as a rule, meet in the Neuer Scal; both these rooms are on the mezzanine (see plan on page 40).

The telephone number for the Conference area is 521687; unless otherwise indicated, all offices mentioned in this handbook are in the Neue Hofburg, and their telephone extensions are connected to that number.

2. INFORMATION DESKS

Two information desks are being provided.

One of them (extensions 420, 421 and 422) is at the entrance to the building (see plan on page 38). Its main task is to channel inquiries: for example, delegates will be able to find from it where the accommodation, documents, post and telegraph and other services are.

A representative of the Oesterreichisches Verkehrsbuero will be at this desk and will provide the usual services of a travel agency, including information on sightseeing and tickets for sightseeing tours. He will also sell opera and theater tickets.

The second desk (extensions 340, 341) is at the top of the main staircase (see plan on page 40), and it will supply details about the work of the Conference and related matters.

3. USHERS

Ushers will be on duty at various points in the Conference area to guide members of delegations to their destinations. They will wear grey armbands bearing the Agency's symbol.

4. EXTERNAL LIAISON AND PROTUCOL

A. Location and staff

The office of the Director of External Liaison and Protocol, Mr. D.A.V. FISCHER, is in room 405 on the first floor (extension 203).

B. Credentials of delegates

The procedure for the issue and submission of delegates' credentials was explained in *Preliminary Information for Delegations* (document GC(IV)/INF/28, paragraphs 7 and 8): it was pointed out that it was desirable

for credentials to be submitted to the Director General not later than 13 September 1960. If special circumstances have prevented a delegate from submitting his credentials in time, he is requested to deposit them in the Protocol Office as soon as he arrives in Vienna.

C. Registration of delegations

Delegations are requested to notify the Protocol Office as early as possible of their addresses, the status of each member (delegate, alternate, adviser, technical adviser, expert, etc.) and whether he is accompanied by his wife, as well as to keep the Protocol Office informed as the session proceeds of any changes in these particulars. Representatives of the United Nations and the specialized agencies, as well as observers from non-member States and from intergovernmental and rongovernmental organizations are also requested to supply similar information. To facilitate the initial notification, a copy of form C-2 is being placed in the distribution box provided for each delegation at the Documents Station (see section 6 below). The revisions of the delegation list (GC(IV)/INF/31) that will be issued from time to time during the session will be based on the information thus provided, and it is therefore important that it should be kept entirely up to dete.

D. Issue of passes, car labels and tickets for meetings

Only persons having passes issued by the Protocol Office will be admitted to the Conference area and to meetings. Admission to the parking area will be granted only to cars displaying identity labels similarly issued. (A diagram of the parking arrangements will be supplied with each identity label). Members of delegations, representatives of the United Nations and the specialized agencies and observers from non-member States and from inter-governmental and non-governmental organizations will receive, on submission of form C-2, individual passes valid for the duration

of the session. Delegations may also obtain from the Protocol Office additional tickets for individual meetings; the number of tickets thus available is limited by the seating accommodation.

E. Arrangements for the opening meeting

Special admission and seating arrangements are being made for the opening plenary meeting of the session on 20 September. The experience of past sessions indicates that it will be difficult to provide seats for all those who would like to attend that meeting, and delegations are therefore particularly requested not to ask for more seats than they need.

F. Arrangements for social events

Delegations are requested to inform the Protocol Office as early as possible of any social events they intend to arrange, so that overlapping may as far as possible be avoided.

5. PUBLIC INFORMATION SERVICE

A. Offices

B. Press releases

Copies of all press releases are put in the distribution box of each delegation at the Documents Station (see section 6 below) immediately upon issue. Extra copies are obtainable from the counter in the Press Room (room 230, extension 410).

C. Press conferences

The Press Liaison Officer will be available to assist delegations wishing to hold press conferences or to distribute statements to information media.

6. DOCUMENTS SERVICES

The Documents Station (room 245, extension 380) is on the mezzanine (see plan on page 40); it will open daily at 8 a.m. and normally shut at 7 p.m. As a document comes off the press copies will be placed in each delegation's distribution box, in languages and numbers corresponding to the requested pattern of distribution. A delegation requiring a change in that pattern should inform the Chief of the Documents Services (Mr. C. Wolff: room 111, extension 310).

7. FACILITIES FOR TRANSLATION, TYPING AND REPRODUCTION

In paragraphs 14 and 15 of Preliminary Information for Delegations (GC(IV)/INF/28) the attention of Governments was drawn to the fact that the Secretariat would only have adequate facilities for translating, typing and copying such papers (memoranda, draft resolutions, etc.) as delegates might wish formally to introduce as part of the work of the session, and which would thus become official documents. It was accordingly suggested that delegations likely to require a large number of copies of other documentary

material for their own purposes should make the necessary reproduction arrangements, on their own account, in advance.

8. SOUND RECORDINGS

Facilities for listening to the sound recordings of meetings are available to delegations in room 305, on the floor above the mezzanine (extension 240).

9. LIBRARY

The services of the Agency's library (rooms 227 and 229 at 11 Kaerntnerring, Vienna I.) are at the disposal of members of delegations and other persons attending the session in an official capacity. All inquiries should be addressed to room 227 (telephone: 52 45 25, extension 201).

10. MEDICAL SERVICES

Emergency medical services are available in the first-aid room (room 141, extension 331), opposite the side entrances to the Zeremoniensaal (see plan on page 40), from 9.30 a.m. until the close of the last meeting of the day. If emergency assistance is required at other times, the Security Office should be notified.

11. SECURITY OFFICE

The Security Office (room 243, extension 396) is on the mezzanine (see plan on page 40). Property lost in the Conference area should be reported there and property found should be either taken to that office or given to one of the ushers.

12. BANKS

The Creditanstalt-Bankverein and the Oesterreichische Laenderbank have branch offices in the entrance hall. They are open from 10 a.m. to 6.30 p.m., Monday to Friday, and will also be open from 10 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. on a Saturday on which a meeting is to be held.

13. LOUNGE AND REFRESHMENTS

The delegates' lounge is in the Wintergarten (extension 294) on the mezzanine (see plan on page 40). An official at the desk in the lounge will take messages for members of delegations and other persons attending the session in an official capacity, arranging for them to be paged when necessary, particularly to receive incoming telephone calls. There is a snack bar in the lounge and another on the first floor next door to the Board room.

14. OUTGOING TELEPHONE CALLS

Local calls may be made free of charge from the telephones in the delegates' lounge and in the corridor adjoining the Festsaal. They can also be made from the telephones near the information desk at the top of the main staircase and on the counter of the Documents Station. Long-distance calls may be made only from the booths next to the post office in the entrance hall.

15. INCOMING TELEGRAMS

Incoming telegrams will be delivered to the information desk at the top of the main staircase (extensions 340 and 341), from where they will be handed to the addressee if he is to be found in the Hofburg, or forwarded to his botel if not.

16. LETTERS AND INVITATIONS

Letters and invitations addressed to members of delegations or to other persons attending the session in an official capacity will be delivered to them at the counter of the Documents Station.

17. SCIENTIFIC EXHIBITION

An exhibition relating to the uses of radioisotopes in agriculture, consisting mainly of photographs, is being arranged in the Zeremoniensaal (see plan on page 40).

II. THE SESSION

18. DURATION OF THE SESSION AND TIMES OF MEETINGS

The session will open at 10.30 a.m. on 20 September and is expected to last about two weeks. The usual times of meetings, both plenary and committee, will be 10.30 a.m. and 3 p.m.

19. PROVISIONAL AGENDA, RULES OF PROCEDURE AND DOCUMENTS LISTS

The provisional agenda for the session is set forth in document GC(IV)/109, and a supplementary list of items in document GC(IV)/109/Add.1. The General Conference's Rules of Procedure are in document GC(II)/INF/16 and addendum 1.

A first list of documents prepared for the session is given in document GC(IV)/DOCS/34; additions will be issued at intervals.

20. JOURNAL '

A Journal will be issued daily. Publication will start a few days before the session opens and continue until immediately after its close. The Journal will give the program of meetings, the agenda items to be taken at each meeting and announcements of general interest.

21. SEATING ARRANGEMENT

For plenary meetings and committees of all Members, the first seat on the left-hand side of the room facing the President or Chairman is allotted to the Member that has provided the Chairman of the Board of Governors during the past year. The Union of South Africa will accordingly occupy this place, followed by Members in the English alphabetical order of their names.

22. CONFERENCE SECRETARIAT

The Director General, as the chief administrative officer of the Agency, is always at the disposal of delegations for consultation. He has, however, delegated general administrative responsibility for the work of the session to the Deputy Director General for Administration, Liaison and Secretariat, Mr. Jolles. 23. SULMISSION OF DRAFT RESOLUTIONS

It will expedite the work of the session if delegations intending to introduce draft resolutions will send five copies as early as possible to the secretary of the appropriate committee.

24. LANGUAGES AND INTERPRETATION

English, French, Russian and Spanish are the working languages of the General Conference. Speeches made in any of these languages will be interpreted simultaneously into the other working languages. By courtesy of the

Austrian Government, interpretation into German will also be provided at plenery meetings.

25. RECEIVING SETS

On request, participants at meetings in the Festsaal will be given portable receiving sets for use during meetings. Printed instructions showing how to select the language wanted will be found on the desks in the meeting room. It is particularly asked that none of the sets nor the headphones be removed from the room at the end of a meeting, so that they may all be individually tested and, if necessary, serviced before the next meeting.

26. PECOGNITION OF SPEAKERS AND VOLING BY SHOW OF HANDS

To facilitate recognition of speakers by committee chairmen, delegates are requested to raise their white name plate when asking for the floor. These name plates should also be used when voting by show of hands.

III. THE SECRETARIAT OF THE AGENCY

27. LOCATION OF OFFICES

Most of the offices of the Secretariat are situated at 11 Kaerntnerring, Vienna I. (telephone: 52 45 25). The language and documents services are however in the Neue Hofburg (telephone: 52 16 87), and branches of the Secretariat responsible for serving the General Conference will also move to this building for the session. The two buildings are about ten minutes' walk apart - in the center of the city near to most of the principal hotels and the main shopping area.

VIII. GENERAL INFORMATION FOR VISITORS

29. CURRENCY

Banknotes of any country, travelers' cheques and letters of credit may be imported into Austria without restriction. Departing visitors may take with them the amount of foreign currency or foreign securities they brought into the country, but not more than \$10,000 in Austrian currency.

30. TRANSPORT IN THE CITY

Taxis. Taxis are readily available; the fare is \$5.40 plus \$3.80 per kilometer. Waiting charge: \$12 an hour. Luggage: \$3-6. These rates do not include the tip. There is no additional charge for night service or extra passengers. The Auto-Ruf day-and-night taxi service has one or more taxi-stands in each district of the city. Their addresses and telephone numbers are listed in the Vienna telephone directory under the general heading "Auto-Ruf". Texis can also be ordered from the Taxi Zentrale (telephone: 63 02 08).

Car hire. Private cars can be hired from several firms against a deposit of S 2000. For a car without a chauffeur the charge per day for 100 kilometers or less is S 200 - 350 according to the type of car. For chauffeur-driven cars the charge per day for 120 kilometers or less is S 400-600. Charges for each additional kilometer: S 1.30 - 2.30 and S 4.50 respectively.

Public transport. There is an extensive public transport system, mainly of trans (Strassenbahn). There are also some buses, and a subway (Stadtbahn) which serves certain areas.

31. EXCURSIONS

Motor coaches. Inquiries about trips by bus or motor coach to places outside Vienna may be made from either the representative of the Oesterreichisches Verkehrsbuero, at the information desk in the entrance hall of the Neue Hofburg, or from Austrobus, I., Dr. Karl Lueger-Ring 8 (telephone: 63 47 47).

River steamers. Inquiries about trips on the Danube by river steamer may be made from the Erste Donau-Dampfschiffahrts-Geseilschaft, I., Kaerntnerstrasse 19 (telephone: 52 51 96).




