ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL CONSEQUENCES OF DISARMAMENT

The paper contributed by the Agency to the United Nations

Note by the Director General

1. Delegations will have noted that in Table 1 of the paper which the Agency contributed to the United Nations on the possible effects on nuclear energy development of an agreement on general and complete disarmament^{1/}, the figure of 2740 was given for the number of scientists and engineers engaged in atomic energy work in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. That figure was obtained from the eighth annual report of the United Kingdom Atomic Energy Authority (UKAEA), as indicated in the second reference at the end of the Agency's paper.

2. The United Kingdom authorities have, however, recently informed the Director General that the figure does not include all the scientists and engineers who were working on atomic energy in UKAEA in January 1962. They state that the total at that time was 5306.
