Resolution adopted during the 81st plenary meeting on 1 October 1963

PROGRAMME OF TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

The General Conference,

(a) <u>Recalling</u> the proposal by Bulgaria, the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic, Hungary, Poland, Romania, the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, contained in document GC(VI)/COM.1/67/Rev.1, to initiate a programme of technical assistance designed to provide the developing countries with all the equipment and apparatus required for the establishment of six radiological centres and six physics laboratories, and also to make available 300 fellowships free of charge to those countries,

(b) <u>Referring</u> to Resolution GC(VI)/RES/131, by which the Board of Governors and the Director General were requested to make a most careful study of the proposal, in order to determine how this and other offers of a like nature might best be introduced into the over-all long-term plan, and

(c) <u>Taking into account</u> the information provided by the Director General concerning the results of his consultations with Member States on this question, $\frac{1}{}$ GC(VII)/RES/152 page 2

1. <u>Requests</u> the Board of Governors to consider the programme set out in document GC(VI)/COM.1/67/Rev.1, bearing in mind that one third of the resources required for it, amounting to 700 000 roubles (approximately .US \$770.000), will be contributed by the sponsors of that draft resolution in the form of equipment and apparatus; and

2. <u>Expresses the hope</u> that further offers may be forthcoming to provide the equipment, apparatus and fellowships for, or the financial resources required to implement the remaining two thirds of the programme.
