a/ This pledge equals or exceeds the percentage of the proposed target of US \$2 million for voluntary contributions (see document GC(XII)/385, para.627) which is equal to the Member's expected percentage assessment under the Regular Budget for next year (GC(XII)/383).

c/ This pledge is subject to increase. The United States of America will contribute an amount equal to 32.5% of all contributions to the General Fund for 1969 that are paid by the end of 1970, up to a percentage of the target equal to its percentage assessment under the Regular Budget for 1969.

d/ 90% pledged in local currency.

2. It is foreseen that the Conference will take the matter of voluntary contributions to the General Fund in a plenary meeting at which the President will invite attention to the list of contributions pledged in advance, and further revisions of the present memorandum will be issued as necessary for the purpose of keeping the Conference informed of the growth in the total value of the pledges made.

3. The delegates of Members that have not yet pledged a contribution to the General Fund for 1969 are accordingly invited to communicate their Governments' pledges as soon as possible to the officer who sits during plenary meetings at a table marked "Voluntary Contributions" near the foot of the podium in the Festsaal, and who will be at a table similarly identified in the Zeremoniensaal at other times.
