ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA FOR THE MEETING (GC(XXVI)/GEN/61)

1. The agenda proposed for the meeting (GC(XXVI)/GEN/61) was adopted.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE CONFERENCE

- (a) ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA AND ALLOCATION OF ITEMS FOR INITIAL DISCUSSION (GC(XXVI)/662, annotation to item 5(a))
- 2. The <u>CHAIRMAN</u> suggested that the General Committee recommend to the General Conference that the agenda for the session should comprise all the items listed in the provisional agenda (GC(XXVI)/662).
- 3. It was so decided.
- 4. The General Committee decided to recommend the General Conference to approve the allocation of items for initial discussion as proposed in document GC(XXVI)/662.
- 5. The <u>CHAIRMAN</u> recalled, with regard to the timetable and the order in which agenda items should be considered, that in the past the Committee had left it to the President of the General Conference to make, in collaboration with the Secretariat, whatever arrangements were necessary to ensure that the time available to delegates was utilized as efficiently as possible.
- (b) CLOSING DATE OF THE SESSION AND OPENING DATE OF THE NEXT SESSION (GC(XXVI)/662, annotation to item 5(b))
- 6. The <u>CHAIRMAN</u> noted that 55 speakers were already entered on the speakers' list for the general debate and that a further 10 or so would probably ask to be registered. Assuming that it would be possible to conclude the general debate by Friday, 24 September, he suggested that the Committee authorize him to recommend to the General Conference that it set Friday, 24 September as the closing date of the session, provided that the Committee of the Whole managed to complete its work by Thursday at the latest.

It was so decided.

8. The <u>CHAIRMAN</u> recalled that, in accordance with Rule 1 of the Rules of Procedure, the General Conference had to set a date for its next regular session and that it was customary for the Committee to make a recommendation to the General Conference on that matter. Traditionally, when the session

took place in Vienna, the General Conference met during the fourth week of September. However, in 1983 two large conferences of interest to many participants in the Conference's session were to be held in September, namely the United Nations Conference for the Promotion of International Co-operation in the Peaceful Uses of Nuclear Energy and the Twelfth World Energy Conference. That being so, it would be best to delay, exceptionally, the date of the next session of the General Conference. The Board of Governors, moreover, in establishing its calendar of meetings for 1983, had for the same reason anticipated 6 and 14 October 1983 as the dates of its meetings. He accordingly proposed that Monday, 10 October 1983 should be set as the opening date of the twenty-seventh regular session. If it was so decided, he would assume that the Committee authorized him to make an oral recommendation to the General Conference to that effect.

9. It was so decided.

NEXT MEETING OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE

- 10. Before adjourning the meeting, the <u>CHAIRMAN</u> recalled that, in accordance with Rule 28 of the Rules of Procedure, the Committee met to examine delegates' credentials. He proposed that its meeting for that purpose should take place on Thursday, 23 September, at 5.30 p.m. in the same room.
- 11. It was so decided.
