> MEASURES TO STRENGTHEN INTERNATIONAL CO-OPERATION IN NUCLEAR SAFETY AND RADIOLOGICAL PROTECTION

INTERNATIONAL LIABILITY FOR DAMAGE ARISING FROM A NUCLEAR ACCIDENT

Draft resolution submitted by Austria, Egypt, the German Democratic Republic, Hungary, Italy, Nigeria and Poland

The General Conference,

- (a) <u>Conscious</u> of the fact that further strengthening of the international liability regime for nuclear damage is essential to the development and use of nuclear energy for peaceful purposes,
- (b) <u>Noting</u> that a number of Member States are parties to the Vienna Convention on Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage and the Paris Convention on Third Party Liability in the Field of Nuclear Energy,
- (c) <u>Noting</u> with satisfaction that the Conference on the Relationship between the Paris and the Vienna Convention adopted on 21 September 1988 a Joint Protocol linking the two Conventions,
- (d) <u>Aware</u> of the fact that the civil liability regime established by the above-mentioned Conventions and the Joint Protocol does not cover all liability issues that might arise in the event of a nuclear accident, and

9332y/208Y 88-4094 (e) <u>Recalling</u> the discussions in the Board of Governors during last three years on the question of international liability, the views of Member States as contained in document GOV/INF/550, and the substantive studies carried out by the Secretariat on this subject;

1. <u>Requests</u> the Board of Governors to continue, as a matter of priority, consideration of the question of international liability for damage arising from a nuclear accident, taking into account the above-mentioned discussions and views and the relevant documents prepared by the Secretariat, including the recommendation to convene an open-ended working group of governmental experts for the purpose of studying further the issues involved in international liability; and

2. <u>Requests</u> the Board of Governors to submit to the General Conference at its thirty-third regular session a report on the progress made in this regard.
