

The General Conference elected the following eleven Members to the Board of Governors to hold office until the end of the thirty-fifth (1991) regular session:

Chile and Venezuela	for Latin America
Belgium and Italy	for Western Europe
Czechoslovakia and Poland	for Eastern Europe
Nigeria and Tunisia	for Africa
Saudi Arabia	for Middle East and South Asia
Philippines	for the Far East
Iraq	for the Middle East and South Asia; or South East Asia and the Pacific; or the Far East.

As a result, the composition of the Board of Governors in 1989-90 is as follows: Algeria, Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, Côte d'Ivoire, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, Egypt, France, German Democratic Republic, Germany, Federal Republic of, Ghana, India, Iraq, Italy, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico, Netherlands, Nigeria, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, Poland, Saudi Arabia, Sweden, Tunisia, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America and Venezuela.
