## STRENGTHENING OF THE AGENCY'S TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION ACTIVITIES

The General Conference,

(a) <u>Recalling</u> resolution GC(XXXVIII)/RES/11 on financing of technical assistance and GC(41)/RES/13 on "Strengthening of the Agency's technical co-operation activities",

(b) <u>Noting</u> that the objectives of the Agency as stated in Article II of the Statute are "to accelerate and enlarge the contribution of atomic energy to peace, health and prosperity throughout the world" and to ensure that the assistance provided is not used to further any military purpose,

(c) <u>Noting</u> also that one of the statutory functions of the Agency is to "encourage and assist research on, and development and practical application of atomic energy for peaceful uses throughout the world",

(d) <u>Considering</u> that an expansion of technical co-operation activities relating to the peaceful uses of nuclear energy will contribute to the well-being and enriching the quality of life of the peoples of the world, and particularly those of developing Member States of the Agency,

(e) <u>Stressing</u> the importance of the transfer of nuclear technology to the developing countries for enhancing their scientific and technological capabilities and thereby generating rapid economic development,

(f) <u>Conscious</u> of the great potential of nuclear power for meeting energy requirements in many countries and the need to protect the environment, and

(g) <u>Desiring</u> that the Agency's resources for technical co-operation activities be assured, predictable and sufficient to meet the objectives mandated in Article II of the Statute, <u>recalling</u> that the Board of Governors approved recommendations to that effect as contained in document GOV/1998/36,

(h) <u>Recalling</u> that the Board of Governors adapted the TCF Planning Cycle to the effect that target figures be determined every two years for a four year period,

(i) <u>Recalling</u> that in the report of the Informal Working Group on Financing of Technical Assistance (GOV/1998/38) it is noted that there would be a perspective of an increase in the target figures for 2001-2002 biennium as compared with the 1999-2000 biennium,

(j) <u>Emphasizing</u> the need to maintain an appropriate balance between the promotional activities and other statutory activities of the Agency,

(k) <u>Recognizing</u> that human resources development is an important component of technical co-operation activities, and

(1) <u>Taking note with appreciation</u> of the different activities carried out by the Secretariat as outlined in document GC(42)/INF/4 to implement the Technical Cooperation Strategy (GOV/INF/824), including an emphasis on sustainable development and improved project design and evaluation; and especially activities to promote TCDC,

1. <u>Stresses</u> the need, in conformity with the Statute, to strengthen technical co-operation activities and also their effectiveness and efficiency and, in this regard, <u>expresses appreciation</u> to the Secretariat for elaboration of the Technical Co-operation Strategy;

2. <u>Notes</u> that agreement has been reached on Indicative Planning Figures (IPFs) for the year 1999-2000 and <u>urges</u> the Board of Governors to resume discussions among Member States with a view to recommending target figures for 2001-2002;

3. <u>Urges</u> all Member States, to make every effort to pay in full and on time their contributions to the Technical Co-operation Fund and <u>reminds</u> Member States of their obligation to pay their Assessed Programme Costs;

4. <u>Requests</u> the Director General to pursue, in consultation with Member States, efforts to strengthen the technical co-operation activities of the Agency through the development of effective programmes aimed at improving the scientific, technological and regulatory capabilities of developing countries, account being taken of the infrastructure and the level of technology of the countries concerned by continuing to assist them in their (a) peaceful applications of atomic energy and nuclear techniques in the fields of agriculture, medicine, industry, water resource management, environment, etc. and (b) nuclear energy production for those States pursuing it as a component of the energy mix in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, through relevant areas of importance as identified by Member States;

5. <u>Emphasizes</u> that these programmes should contribute to achieving sustainable development in developing countries, and particularly in least developed countries;

6. <u>Requests</u> the Director General to continue to take account of the view of the General Conference on this question when requesting Member States to pledge their respective shares of the Technical Co-operation Fund targets and to make timely payments to the Fund;

7. <u>Requests</u> the Director General to continue the Agency's efforts to identify regional centres of excellence, in consultation with the relevant regional groups in the context of enhancing Technical Co-operation among Developing Countries (TCDC); and

8. <u>Requests</u> the Director General and the Board of Governors to remain seized of this matter and <u>further requests</u> the Director General to report to the Board of Governors periodically and to the General Conference at its forty-third session on the implementation of this resolution under an agenda item entitled "Strengthening of the Agency's technical co-operation activities".
