REGULAR BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS FOR 2002

Resolution adopted on 21 September 2001 at the ninth plenary meeting

The General Conference,

Accepting the recommendations of the Board of Governors relating to the Regular Budget of the Agency for $2002^{\frac{1}{2}}$,

1. <u>Appropriates</u> on the basis of an exchange rate of $\notin 0.9229$ to \$1.00, an amount of $\$245\ 107\ 000$ for the Regular Budget expenses of the Agency in 2002 as follows $\frac{2}{2}$:

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- 2. <u>Decides</u> that the foregoing appropriation shall be financed, after the deduction of
 - revenues deriving from Reimbursable Work for Others (Section 8); and
 - other miscellaneous income of \$4 301 000 (representing \$3 015 000 plus €1 187 000);
 - and part of the 1999 cash surplus (for the Special Appropriation for the Acquisition of Safeguards Equipment);

from contributions by Member States amounting, for an exchange rate of ≤ 0.9229 to 1.00, to 234 407 000 (41 940 000 plus $\leq 177 628 000$), in accordance with the scale of assessment fixed by the General Conference in resolution GC(45)/RES/8; and

- 3. <u>Authorizes</u> the Director General:
 - (a) To incur expenditures additional to those for which provision is made in the Regular Budget for 2002, provided that the relevant emoluments of any staff involved and all other costs are entirely financed from revenues arising out of sales, work performed for Member States or international organizations, research grants, special contributions or other sources extraneous to the Regular Budget for 2002; and
 - (b) With the prior approval of the Board of Governors, to make transfers between any of the Sections listed in paragraph 1 above.
