TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION FUND ALLOCATION FOR 2003

Resolution adopted on 19 September 2002 during the 7th plenary meeting

The General Conference,

<u>Noting</u> the decision of the Board of Governors to recommend that for 2003 and 2004 the target for voluntary contributions to the Agency's Technical Co-operation Fund shall be \$74 750 000 in each of these years, that the Indicative Planning Figures for 2005 and 2006 shall be no less than \$75 000 000, and that the actual targets for the latter two years will be set in 2004, taking into account the results of the Board's review of the rate of attainment mechanism which will be then available, as well as other factors relevant to setting Technical Co-operation Fund targets,

<u>Accepting</u> the recommendation of the Board of Governors relating to the target for voluntary contributions to the Agency's Technical Co-operation Fund for 2003 $\frac{1}{2}$,

- 1. <u>Decides</u> that for 2003 the target for voluntary contributions to the Technical Co-operation Fund shall be \$74 750 000;
- 2. <u>Notes</u> that funds from other sources, estimated at \$1 000 000, are expected to be available for that programme;
- 3. <u>Allocates</u> the amount of \$75 750 000 for the Agency's Technical Co-operation programme for 2003; and
- 4. <u>Urges</u> all Member States to make voluntary contributions for 2003 in accordance with Article XIV.F of the Statute, with paragraph 2 of its Resolution GC(V)/RES/100 as amended by Resolution GC(XV)/RES/286 or with paragraph 3 of the former Resolution, as appropriate.
