## Examination of Delegates' Credentials Second Report of the General Committee

1. At its second meeting, on 29 September 2022, the General Committee examined the credentials of delegates to the session, as provided for in Rule 28 of the Conference's Rules of Procedure.

2. At the outset, the Chair of the Committee mentioned Rules 27, 28 and 29 of the Rules of Procedure, and recalled the following points of Rule 27 regarding credentials for the General Conference:

- (a) Credentials designate the delegate of a Member State to a given session of the General Conference;
- (b) They are to be submitted to the Director General; and
- (c) They are to be issued by the Head of State or Government or by the Minister of Foreign Affairs.

3. Credentials satisfying the requirements of Rule 27 of the Rules of Procedure have been submitted to the Director General for the delegates of the following 103 Members:

4. Various official communications, which do not constitute formal credentials under Rule 27 of the Rules of Procedure have been received for the delegates of the following 49 Members:<sup>1</sup>

The Chair of the Committee pointed out that the Committee had received a document (GC(66)/20) submitted by the Arab Member States of the IAEA participating in the sixty-sixth regular session of the IAEA General Conference, regarding their reservations about the credentials of the Israeli delegation, as well as a document (GC(66)/21) submitted by the Resident Representative of Israel to the IAEA, which sets out the position of Israel with regard to the reservations expressed by the Arab Member States of the IAEA participating in the sixty-sixth regular session of the IAEA General Conference. The Chair also pointed out that the Committee had received a document (GC(66)/19) containing a statement by the Islamic Republic of Iran setting out its position regarding the credentials of Israel.

6. Further, the Chair of the Committee proposed that, in accordance with past practice, those delegates for whom proper credentials had not been received should, nevertheless, be allowed to participate in the work of the Conference on the understanding that they would submit credentials in due form as soon as possible, preferably before the end of the current session of the Conference.

7. The Committee, with the reservations and positions expressed above, agreed to recommend that the Conference adopt the following draft resolution:

"Examination of delegates' credentials
