Statement of H.E. President Fidel V. Ramos on Pakistan's Nuclear Testing

Manila, 29 May 1998

The Philippines expresses its deep concern and utmost dismay over the series of nuclear tests conducted yesterday by Pakistan in response to the nuclear explosions carried out by India. Pakistan conducted the tests in defiance of global efforts aimed at banning nuclear tests and in utter disregard of appeals for restraint by the international community.

These nuclear tests are serious blows to regional security and to the global non-proliferation regime and international nuclear disarmament efforts. The latest tests not only escalate the nuclear race in South Asia but more importantly, divert scarce resources to nuclear weapons and missile development programs from the imperatives of economic and social developments.

The Philippines urges Pakistan and India to refrain from any action that could further exacerbate the tense situation in the Asian sub-continent and to adhere to the comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty and the Non-Proliferation Treaty.

We reiterate our call on States concerned to show utmost restraint to stem the nuclear arms race and to safeguard peace and stability in the region. We likewise urge the Big Powers to use their influence to discourage future nuclear testings and the need for nuclear weapons.
