Statement by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Russian Federation

Russia wishes to express its deepest concern at the testing of nuclear devices by Pakistan on 28 May 1998. This action was undertaken despite insistent appeals by the world community to Islamabad to exercise restraint and not to act upon the "eye for an eye" principle in response to the nuclear explosions conducted by India on 11 and 13 May 1998.

It is a matter of regret that the Pakistani leadership was unable to quell emotions and demonstrate circumspection and prudence at an extremely critical juncture.

The long-standing confrontation and rivalry between India and Pakistan has now acquired a completely new nuclear complexion, extremely dangerous for all mankind, with a real threat of nuclear weapons spreading around the world.

Russia supports a truly universal international non-proliferation regime incorporating all States without exception and once again strongly urges Pakistan, as well as India, to heed the voice of the world community, desist from further tests and accede without delay to both the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons and the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty.
