STATEMENT BY HIS EXCELLENCY DATO' ADNAN OTHMAN TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE 61ST GENERAL CONFERENCE OF THE IAEA 18 SEPTEMBER 2017

Ladies and Gentlemen

I am indeed very delighted to see the participation of so many ministers and senior officials from Member States to our session this morning. This is a clear testimony of the support and importance we attach to the Agency and for its noble endeavours.

2. The 61st General Conference provides us with another opportunity to come together to share our accomplishments, ambitions, expectations and challenges. The General Conference is an important platform for Member States to identify common ground among their different priorities, where objective assessments could be drawn from various efforts and initiatives implemented by both Member States and the Agency. The General Conference is also a worthwhile stock-taking exercise for Member States to develop appropriate guidelines and clearer direction for the Agency which would enhance the efficiency as well as strengthen transparency and accountability of the Agency, to ensure better results and decisive actions.

In our common pursuit of this goal, we would like to commend the continued commitment of Director-General Yukiya Amano and the Agency to facilitate the implementation of various activities and initiatives that would

benefit Member States. The Agency's noble efforts and activities, be it, in the field of nuclear science and application, nuclear safety, nuclear security, safeguard and verification, as well as technical cooperation continuously require our consensus, cooperation and support.

- 4. Since the 60th General Conference last year, many significant meetings have been held in Vienna. These meetings have presented perspectives on key challenges and lessons-learned, particularly, on ways the Agency can better perform its role to facilitate as well as to strengthen coordination and coherence across its activities and initiatives related to the peaceful use of nuclear technology.

Nevertheless, the outcome of these meetings, on the whole, had indirectly served the purpose of increasing awareness, understanding and ownership of these issues by Member States, and provided a good foundation to take forward the implementation of the important agenda in the Agency. Through mutual trust and confidence, more targeted activities could be aligned with the priorities of Member States and in accordance with the Agency's Statute. The synergy between Member States and the Agency will definitely strengthen our collective aspirations and help create an environment conducive to a more cohesive cooperation.

The technical cooperation program continues to be a key driver for Member States' efforts to achieve sustainable socio-economic development, in particular, the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. We commend the efforts and congratulate the Agency for the successful convening of the 1st International Conference on the IAEA Technical Cooperation Program a few months ago. The Agency has continued to devote more resources in the areas of health and nutrition, nuclear safety, food and agriculture. The modernization of nuclear applications

under the ReNuAL project is a noteworthy effort by the Agency to facilitate the implementation of sustainable development goals.

7. The achievements made by the Agency are laudable and evident. The Agency has done well over the last 60 years, and we are confident that it would continue to do even better over the next 60 Years. Our deepest gratitude and sincere appreciation to Director-General Yukiya Amano and his very able team for all their tireless efforts and commitments. We will continue to render our fullest support and cooperation to him and the Agency.
