## Agreement between the Republic of Malta and the International Atomic Energy Agency for the Application of Safeguards in Connection with the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons

## An Agreement by Exchange of Letters with the Republic of Malta to rescind the Protocol to the Safeguards Agreement

1. The text of the Exchange of Letters, constituting an agreement to rescind the Protocol<sup>1</sup> to the Agreement between the Republic of Malta and the International Atomic Energy Agency for the Application of Safeguards in Connection with the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons<sup>2</sup>, is reproduced in this document for the information of all Member States of the Agency.

2. The rescission agreed upon in the Exchange of Letters entered into force on 1 September 2021, the date of the Agency's reply to the Republic of Malta confirming the rescission.
